Course Content information

- Component 1 & 2 internally assessed assignments- 60% of overall grade.
- Component 3 is an externally assessed synoptic exam- 40% of overall grade. Component 3 exam paper will be sat in February of Year 11 (early entry). Second opportunity to re-sit the exam in May to improve grade.

Component 1- Human lifespan and development. This includes the growth and development of individuals from infancy to later adulthood and coping with life events. <u>Component 1 is assessed with two written</u> <u>essays.</u>

Component 2- Health and Social Care services and care values. This includes exploring the NHS and the responsibilities of professional roles within health and social care settings. This component also involves demonstrating the care values. <u>Component 2 is assessed with one</u> <u>written essay, a role play and a review.</u>

Component 3- Factors that affect growth and development, life events, interpreting lifestyle data, interpreting physiological indicators (BMI, Peak Flow, Pulse Rate, Blood Pressure), creating a health and wellbeing plan and potential obstacles within Health and Social Care settings. **Component 3 is assessed with a synoptic externally assessed exam.**





How does the grading work?

Students achieve a grade for each component, which are allocated points. At the end of the course, we calculate the final grade by adding the points from each component, and matching this against the qualification grade point thresholds.



Our qualification goes from Level 1 Pass to Level 2 Distinction* to ensure all students' achievements are recognised. Students need to achieve a L1 Pass or above in the three components to achieve the qualification.

Possible Career Links


Recognised by employers and universities


What are my students' options for progression after the course?

Where can my students progress to?






